

To the vast majority of our members, who continue to support our association as before, we want to assure you that your board and employees continue supporting you as well. We continue to carry the liability insurance on all LCPOA common properties, including green areas and beach clubs, for the protection of all of us. Our office staff is busy handling the affairs associated with the start of each season. The lodge is being cleaned and preped for another busy season. Beach clubs and facilities are being cleaned up following a very hard winter. Our maintenance crew removed more than 100 dead or fallen trees from our common areas. Firewise crews continue their voluntary efforts to clean up and reduce fire danger in many of our green areas. Additional volunteers are replanting green areas where many trees have died. Our voluntary water testing program will begin on May 21st and continue monthly through the summer. TriLakes has agreed to pick up the \$3700 cost this year. So, for those of you who recognize the benefit of an association watching out for your best interests at the lake, thanks for your continuing support.

For those still unclear about the state of our LCPOA association, the recent Appeals Court decision questioned only the legality of the extension of our covenants. It had no bearing on the valid existence of our LCPOA association; it's articles of incorporation, the bylaws, or the rules and regulations. We've received a number of legal opinions supporting this and continue to serve our members as before. We will remind you that your LCPOA association is the sole deedholder of a number of properties around the lake, including the lodge, dump stations, boat launch and other access areas. In addition, the association is a deeded, fractional owner of the 55 properties representing all outlots and beachclubs.

As a result of suggestions made at our last board meeting, a group of your fellow members has formed a committee to review our covenants, bylaws, rules and regulations to eliminate redundancy with existing government ordinances, and establish a more current set of guidelines that we can all live with. The committee is made up of campers, fulltime homeowners, weekenders, and vacant lot owners, and led by Craig Manka.

From dues receipts to date, we have received excellent support from our membership, and expect very few holdouts. Those who don't pay dues or obtain necessary permits are considered in violation of LCPOA existing requirements and will be subject to appropriate penalties. Further, they will not be allowed to use LCPOA owned facilities or participate in LCPOA meetings or elections.

Your LCPOA board, staff and volunteers continue working toward the preservation and improvement of our beautiful Lake Camelot environment. We thank all of you who continue to contribute by paying your fair share and volunteering your help.

As a reminder, the annual meeting will be held at 9:00 a.m. on June 21st at our Lodge. Bring your lawn chair just in case we can't fit everyone in the Lodge. The announcement of election results will be held the night before, June 20th at 7:30 p.m.
