LCPOA has a new committee!! It is the Environmental Committee. Committee members will work on Firewise, Water Quality Testing, Reforestation and other environmental concerns. Bob Budjac is the board member overseeing this committee. Common areas around Lake Camelot have been neglected and abused for many years, and many members feel it is time to start protecting what we have, and improving it for the future. Many property owners and guests are needed to carry out this mission. You can help!!

### **Ways to help**

1. Join the committee. Over 300 trees were ordered from Adams County for property owners to put on their own properties. We need help on delivery day, which will be April 19, 2008 from Noon – 3:00 p.m.
2. Sign up to help plant trees in green areas that have been cleared out by Firewise volunteers. 900 Trees have been ordered from the DNR to plant in green areas around our lake. We need lots of help to get them all planted.
3. Join the Firewise workers. We need help on the committee, help from people willing to work a few hours a weekend anywhere on the lake there is an active project, and/or people willing to start a project in their own neighborhood.
4. Volunteer for the water quality testing. We need people to go out with a group to get the samples, do the actual testing, and mail the samples to the proper place for results.
5. We need people to start talking to neighbors who are abusing the green areas with ATV and Snowmobile riding, and throwing yard waste or concrete there instead of Disposing of it properly.
