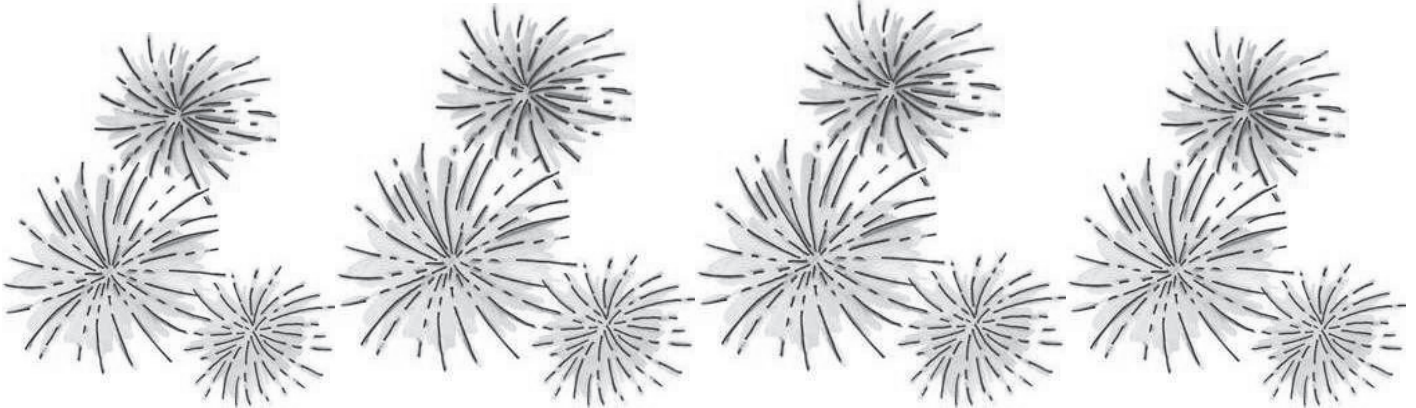

Please be observant of the following:

Slow No-Wake — The slowest possible speed the boat can maintain steerage.

Speed Restrictions — No power boat shall be operated at a greater speed than slow no-wake before sunrise or after 8 p.m. or at any time when entering, traveling in or leaving a posted section of water.

Boat travel speed is a concern for the members who live on the channel. Please respect the members who own property on the channel. Use the slow no-wake speed when traveling through the channel.

The boat launches can be very slippery. Please be very careful when using the launches we do not want to see anyone get hurt.

The drawdown for Lake Camelot does not have a set date however the tentative time period is from Sept. 30th to Oct. 30th. When we get the dates from the DNR we will let everyone know through the Monthly E News. The drawdown is being done so that property owners can perform any repairs to their shoreline or piers. Please remember to check with DNR if you need to take out a permit for the work you are planning.

REMINDER FROM MONTHLY E NEWS

A Message from Tri-Lakes Management:

Dam Repairs Planned for Sherwood and Arrowhead in July, Adams County has scheduled repairs to the dam gates on the Sherwood and Arrowhead dams. Water levels on the lakes will need to be lowered approximately 6 inches in order to facilitate the repairs. Here is the planned schedule: Lake levels will start to be lowered the week of July 13th to the 17th. Lake Sherwood repairs will start July 20th and then the construction team will move to Lake Arrowhead for repairs on the 22nd or 23rd of July (if all goes well on Sherwood). Lake Sherwood will start to refill on the 22nd or 23rd with water that will be held in Lake Camelot during the repairs. Lake Arrowhead will start to refill on the 25th if construction is completed as planned. It's important to understand that water levels returning to normal levels will be dependent on the influence from the watershed as well as the amount of rainfall. If Adams County is in a dry condition, it may take additional time to get back to normal levels. To help with the refilling, water will be held in Lake Camelot (not to exceed 6 inches above normal) during the repairs. Excess water from Camelot will be released into Sherwood to start to increase the lake level after construction has occurred and all tests have been completed for correct gate installation per contractor and engineering requirements. Once the water level increases in Lake Sherwood, it will be allowed to pass into Lake Arrowhead to increase the water levels there.

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND EVEN THO THIS WORK IS NOT BEING DONE ON OUR LAKE, THERE IS A VERY GOOD POSSIBILITY THAT THIS WORK WILL AFFECT OUR LAKE LEVELS.

MEMBERSHIP CARDS AND STICKERS

The LCPOA sent a mailing within a few days of receiving your dues payment, which included the small green membership sticker and two vehicle stickers. This process may have caught some off guard this year and you may have overlooked our mailing. Because next year the membership sticker for the back of your card will contain the code for the gates at the launch areas, we will continue to mail out the stickers directly after receiving your dues payment.

If you have a 2nd membership card with a number 2 on it, please bring it to the Center and we will give you a sticker to validate it for the year.

The small green sticker is to be placed on the backside of your membership card over the top-middle 2006-2007 spot to validate it for the 2015-2016 year. The vehicle stickers are to be placed on the passenger side of the windshield of primary launch vehicles. This identifies you as a member while at the launch areas.

HOW DO I USE MY MEMBERSHIP CARD?!?

Your membership card, with the current sticker on the backside, acts as a passport for you, your family and guests while at the Lodge and also as a way to keep the code for the launch gates handy. When visiting the Lodge, you will present your card when signing out any sports equipment, using the showers or reserving the tennis court.

Your card is most effective when it is readily available for all to use. To accomplish this we suggest using a lanyard and designating a spot in your home or camper to hang the card. Lanyards are available at the Center . . . pick one up during your next visit!

TRI-LAKES MANAGEMENT DISTRICT REPORT

HELP US . . . HELP YOU!

While it seems like warmer weather may never come, we know that all of a sudden, our Wisconsin spring will turn into summer and with that will be weed growth in our lakes.

Our mission is to help improve the quality and enjoyment of Lakes Arrowhead, Camelot, Walden and Sherwood. The biggest challenge we face each summer is trying to stay ahead of the weeds as they seem to really grow on each lake at different times. Unfortunately, a residual of weed harvesting are the “floaters” or weeds that are left behind as the machines cut them. This, of course, is not by any means intentional, but is simply the result of weeds that fall off the conveyors before they can be picked up. When that happens, we do our best to pick up as many of those as we can before they reach the shoreline, but there will always be some that we just can't catch up with fast enough. Those are the ones that many of the lake owners end up having to rake up from their beach. The harvester crews are glad to remove those that you rake into piles but there are a few DO's and DON'Ts that we would like to call to your attention that will **HELP US to HELP YOU!**

DO's:

- Pile weeds on the end of your pier or on the shore within easy access of the harvester crew.
- Place weeds where there is adequate room for the harvester to pull up to the pile. Because of the width of the harvester, there needs to be at least a 10-foot opening between docks, boats, rafts or other obstructions.
- Rinse all sand or dirt from the weeds that you pull from the lake bottom. If the weed pile is full of sand (heavy), the pile will not be picked up so as not to cause injury to our operators.
- If you have a boat lift (whether in use or not) please raise it high enough so most of the support arms are clear of the water. This helps to prevent weeds from piling up on and around the lift and the harvester crew is better able to flush the weeds out of the way.
- If you have a lawn sprinkling system, we recommend hanging the intake basket under your pier to eliminate the chance of the harvester damaging the equipment. If this is not possible, please mark the location of the intake basket with a floating object such as a duck. We will not be responsible for damages if it is not marked.
- Please put your address on your pier – it makes it much easier to direct our operators to your property if needed if your address is visible. The lake looks very different from the water.

DON'Ts:

- Don't hide your weeds behind something so you can't see them. If you can't see them, the harvester crew probably can't either.
- Don't put flowers, yard clippings, branches or other debris in or on the pile of lake weeds. If you do, they will not be picked up.

Thank You!

Before you dump, think twice!! Did you know that it's illegal to dump anything into the lakes in Wisconsin? Even natural items (like leaves and debris) can have an adverse effect on the water quality and ecosystem of the lake. That's why laws were created – to protect this great natural resource that we all enjoy. Fines for dumping such things as leaves start at \$200 and increase as the danger of the contaminants themselves increase. Do not put anything in the lakes without a permit – this includes leaves, salt, chemicals (especially those widely advertised as a control for lake weeds – they actually make the situation worse and are illegal!).

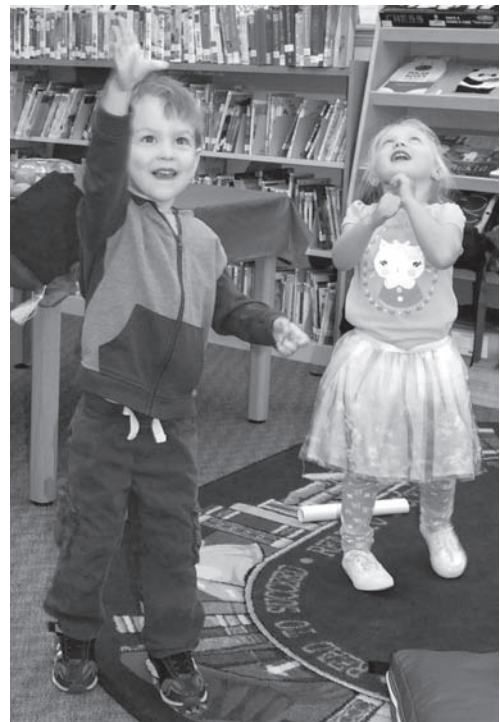

Calls to the Police Department have started to increase signaling the beginning of our busy season. Part-time residents are returning and seasonal visits have already begun. Many of our part-time residents have called to let the Police Department know they have returned and are thankful for the extra patrol that was given to their homes while they were away.

Also, many Rome residents will be planning vacations soon. While your neighbors are gone, if you witness suspicious activity or a neighbor's property looks damaged, please call the Adams County Dispatch Center at 1-877-885-9977 so a Rome Officer can be dispatched to investigate.

If you are planning a vacation yourself, please feel free to call the Rome Police Department or the Town Hall (325-8013) so that a Vacant Home form can be filled out. This form makes the Police Officers aware of vacant properties and gives us contact information in case we would need to get a hold of you when you are gone.

As Rome's population increases for the summer please be respectful to your neighbors. While we all want to have fun and enjoy our community, we must keep in mind that our neighbors are not far away. In the past we have had problems with noise and especially the discharging of illegal fireworks. The police department is attempting to take a proactive approach to the firework problems by eliminating the sale of illegal fireworks in the town. However, many residents purchase these illegal fireworks from other places and bring the fireworks to Rome to shoot them off. This is not only illegal, but can create a major safety problem for residents and visitors. Therefore, anyone caught discharging illegal fireworks by a Rome Police Officer will have the fireworks confiscated and will face a \$ 250.00 municipal citation.

Two part-time Recreational Officers have been hired to patrol our lakes throughout the summer months. The purpose of the boat patrol is to make sure that the lakes stay safe and that everyone can enjoy themselves no matter what water sport they are participating in. If you see boating violations occurring please contact the Dispatch Center so a Rome Officer can be sent to investigate. We do our best to provide equal patrol on all Rome's Lakes.

Lastly, a reminder that the Town of Rome does allow ATV's to travel on most town roads in order to access the designated ATV route system. However, these access roads only allow you to travel from your property to the route. You may not travel up and down an access road, drive your ATV on these roads at any time other than to drive directly to, or return directly from an ATV route. I urge you to stop in at Pritzl's Corner Mart or the Rome Town Hall to pick up an ATV route map and to get clarification on any ATV rule you don't understand. Driving on private property of others, unmarked roads, or fire lanes will result in a citation if you are identified.

I wish everyone a safe and enjoyable summer. Please feel free to stop in the Town Hall with any questions you may have.

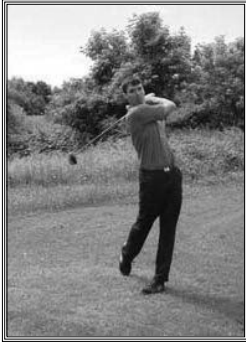

BULLETIN BOARD REMINDERS

Although most of our LCPOA members are aware of the following information, we always have a turnover in ownership. New owners and/or guests may find these reminders helpful. They are offered in the interest of fostering sound neighborhood relations and a deeper appreciation of our surroundings.

WATERFRONT PROPERTIES

Waterfront/on-shore property owners own their property down to the water's edge. Using piers and the shoreline for fishing, shortcutting between properties or strolling without the owner's permission is considered trespassing.

GREEN AREAS/OUTLOTS

Green Areas/Outlots definition: Forested area between properties. In the **Walden Area** this includes the forested area between property lines and the water's edge.

All Green Areas/Outlots are *deeded property* to off-shore owners. Walking through or using one of these areas that is not deeded to you is considered trespassing. If you are in doubt as to which area is deeded to you, please contact the Member's Center or Business Office for assistance.

No types of motorized vehicles is encouraged in any green area, including ATVs, lawn mowers or snowmobiles.

No cutting of trees or underbrush without a FIREWISE Program permit.

*A Firewise permit application is available at the Member's Service Center along with contacts for assistance in implementing your project. The Firewise Program is initiated by volunteer property owners who want to clean up their green space with coordinated chipping help from the LCPOA. It has been a very helpful and successful program for our lake area. If you have any questions about the program or getting a project started in your green area, please feel open to contact the Association.

WALDEN PROPERTY *(the area to the North of the bridge on County D)*

All of the forested and sandy area down to the water's edge is deeded to the property owners of the Walden area. Using this property, on either side of the lake, for walking, hiking, fishing etc. by non-owners is considered trespassing. No motors of any type are allowed in the Walden lake area.

BEACH CLUBS

Beach Clubs are waterfront property deeded to off-shore property owners. Only the off-shore owners deeded to a particular beach club are entitled to use it. All others are considered trespassing. Please keep in mind that deeded beach club owners may be from more than one subdivision. For example, Sheffield beach club has deeded owners from Knight Shield, Sheffield and White Stallion subdivisions.

BOAT PARKING AT BEACH CLUBS

Although all property owners deeded to a Beach Club have the right of use, boat parking is at a premium. With the idea of being a good neighbor and in fairness to all, we encourage owners to please remove your watercraft from your Beach Club when you will not be using it for a few days or weeks.

GATES AT LAUNCH AREAS

Out of respect for all who have made an investment in membership to the Association and want to reserve the use of the launches for members only, *please remember to close the gates after each use.* All paid members have the code.

FIREWORKS

By order of the Rome Police Department:

Fireworks are illegal...You will be fined if you are caught using them.

CANOPIES

Canopies that house boats/motorized vehicles or are being used as sheds are not allowed in the Town of Rome. These canopies with fabric or aluminum tops do not have permits issued as garages or sheds and do not meet the building code requirements for these structures.

PROPERTY OWNERS INTENDING TO BUILD

Property owners and their contractors or enlisted agents: To abide by the Town of Rome ordinances, property owners or their enlisted agents are responsible for showing the Zoning Administrator and Building Inspector the lot stakes. If they cannot be found, it is required of the property owner or agent to hire a surveyor to establish the lot lines.

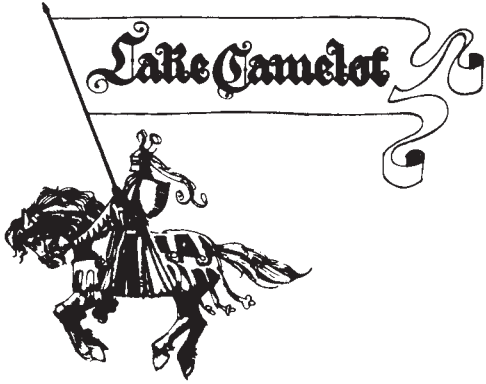
